Premier Akeeagok tabled the Katujjiluta Sixth Assembly Mandate during the winter sitting of the Legislature.



Government of Canada invests in sustainable water infrastructure in Iqaluit

Prime Mister Justin Trudeau and Minster of Northern Affairs Daniel Vandal were joined by Premier Akeeagok, Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. President, Aluki Kotierk and City of Iqaluit Mayor, Kenny Bell, to announce federal funding of over \$214 million through the Disaster and Mitigation Adaptation Fund to ensure the safety and long-term sustainability of Iqaluit's water supply system.
