Katujjiluta Sixth Assembly Mandate

Premier Akeeagok tabled the Katujjiluta Sixth Assembly Mandate during the winter sitting of the Legislature.

For the first time in Nunavut's history, the Government's mandate was developed through a dialogue between all members of the Legislative Assembly, the leadership of Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. and Nunavut's three Regional Inuit Organizations.

Government of Canada invests in sustainable water infrastructure in Iqaluit

Meeting with Minister LeBlanc

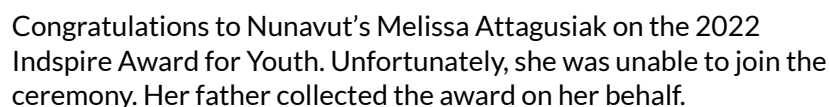

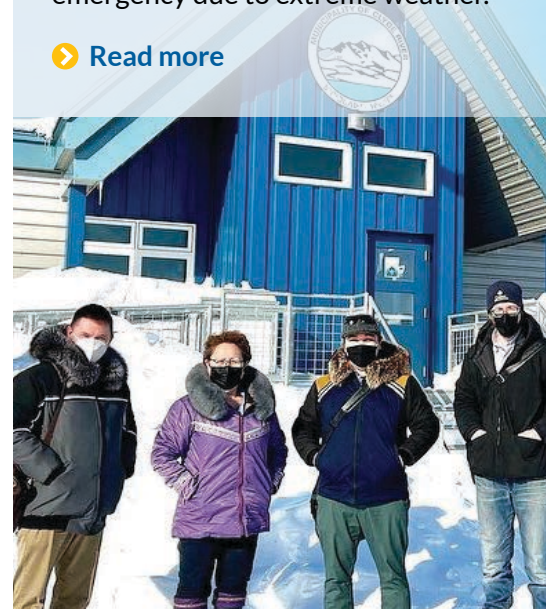
