## Nunavut commemorates National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

September 30<sup>th</sup> marked the fourth National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, also known as Orange Shirt Day. Premier Akeeagok was honoured to attend events in Iqaluit, organized by the Qikiqtani Inuit Association, to recognize and pay respect to those lost in residential schools and impacted survivors, families and communities. September 30<sup>th</sup> was also an opportunity to celebrate the strength and resilience of Inuit communities in the face of systemic oppression.









# Direct flight between Iqaluit and Greenland returns

On June 26<sup>th</sup>, Iqaluit welcomed the first direct flight from Nuuk, Greenland with a community event. The creation of this route follows the Memorandum of Understanding signed between Nunavut and Greenland in 2022 to bolster cooperation in areas such as culture, fisheries, travel and tourism, and more.





## **GN** funds mobility vans for Elders

In support of the Katujjiluta Mandate priority, Aging with Dignity, the Government of Nunavut provided specialized mobility vans for Elders to five communities. These vans will offer Elders greater mobility within their community. Local drivers will gain training and skills in the operation of the vans.

### **Canada's Premiers meet in Halifax**

Premier Akeeagok attended the Council of the Federation summer meeting July 15-17 in Halifax. Canada's premiers discussed ways governments can work together to better support Canadians. Arctic sovereignty and security were key discussion points as well as infrastructure, housing, and critical minerals. During the meetings, Premier Akeeagok had a chance to hold side meetings with Prince Edward Island's Premier Dennis King, as well as Manitoba's Premier Wab Kinew.

# Premier Akeeagok attends Western Premiers' Conference

In June, Premier Akeeagok traveled to Whitehorse, Yukon to meet with Canada's western premiers. Discussions during the conference focused on affordability, economic prosperity, and improved quality of life for Western Canadians.





#### **Meetings in Ottawa**

On September 16<sup>th</sup>, Premier Akeeagok met with Deputy Prime Minister Freeland, as well as Ministers LeBlanc and Vandal to highlight Nunavut's priorities, including housing, economic development, reconciliation and Arctic sovereignty and security. He also met with Nunavut's Member of Parliament Lori Idlout to coordinate joint efforts to advocate for Nunavummiut on Parliament Hill.

While in Qikiqtarjuaq, Cabinet Ministers visited the location of the future deep sea port. This project will create offshore fisheries opportunities and improve deep water capabilities for military, search and rescue operations and cruise ships.
